Chapter 74

RESOLVE, Regulating Fishing in Round Pond and Fry Pan Pond, Somerset County.

Round pond and Fry Pan pond; regulating fishing. Resolved: That the commissioner of inland fisheries and game be, and hereby is, authorized and directed to issue a rule and regulation limiting Round pond and Fry Pan pond, in Square town, Somerset county, to fly fishing only; and be it further

Resolved: That the commissioner of inland fisheries and game be, and hereby is, authorized and directed to issue a rule and regulation establishing a daily bag limit of $7\frac{1}{2}$ pounds of fish per person from Moose river from Brassua dam to Moosehead lake.

Chapter 75

RESOLVE, Limiting Catch of Pickerel in Brann's Mill Pond, Piscataquis County.

Catch of pickerel in Brann's Mill pond, limited. Resolved: That the commissioner of inland fisheries and game be, and hereby is, authorized and directed to issue a rule and regulation changing the daily bag limit of pickerel caught from Brann's Mill pond from 10 to 5 fish.

Chapter 76

RESOLVE, to Make Lawful the Fishing for Cusk in Long Lake and Sebago Lake, Cumberland County.

Fishing in Sebago lake regulated. Resolved: That the commissioner of inland fisheries and game be, and hereby is, authorized and directed to issue a rule and regulation opening Long lake in the towns of Naples, Bridgton and Harrison and Sebago lake in the county of Cumberland to fishing through the ice for cusk with not more than 5 set lines per person, which lines shall have a sinker thereon of not less than 4 ounces in weight which shall be not more than 12 inches from the end of the line to which

the hook is attached, said sinker being placed on the bottom of the lake when not in use. Provided that set lines for cusk within the provisions of this resolve shall be plainly marked with the name and address of the person who set the same and need not be under his immediate supervision between the hours of 4 P. M. and 8 A. M. following.

Chapter 77

RESOLVE, Extending Appropriation of Money to Improve the Approach to the Fish Way at Aroostook Falls.

Resolves, 1947, c. 146, amended. Resolved: That the last paragraph of chapter 146 of the resolves of 1947, as enacted by chapter 53 of the resolves of 1949 be, and hereby is, amended to read as follows:

'All unexpended balances shall not lapse until June 30, ~~1951~~ 1953, but shall remain a continuing carrying account until June 30, ~~1951~~ 1953.'

Chapter 78

RESOLVE, Relating to Taking Crabs in Cumberland County.

Rule and regulation. Resolved: That the commissioner of sea and shore fisheries be, and hereby is, authorized and directed to issue a rule and regulation to prohibit fishing for, taking or catching crabs in any manner in the county of Cumberland from December 15th to March 15th, inclusive.

Chapter 79

RESOLVE, in Favor of the Town of Stockholm.

Debt of town of Stockholm; cancelled. Resolved: That the county commissioners of Aroostook county be, and hereby are, authorized to cancel the debt up to January 1, 1950, for excise taxes for motor vehicles received from persons residing in unorganized territory.
