## Chapter 80

### RESOLVE, in Favor of Westmanland Plantation.

**Westmanland plantation; appropriation for. Resolved:** That the sums appropriated in favor of Westmanland plantation by the 93rd and 94th legislatures to repair the Stockholm road, so called, be, and hereby are, reappropriated to be expended in repairing the Espling road, so called, beginning  $\frac{3}{4}$  of a mile from the end of state aid road #1 in a southerly direction and extending in an easterly direction to the New Sweden town line.

## Chapter 81

### RESOLVE, Providing for a Fish Screen at Outlet of Highland Lake in the Town of Bridgton.

**Outlet of Highland lake; screening of. Resolved:** That the sum of \$500 be, and hereby is, appropriated from the funds of the department of inland fisheries and game, for installing a fish screen at the outlet of Highland lake in the town of Bridgton in the county of Cumberland; provided, however, that said screen shall not be installed at the outlet of Highland lake until the town of Bridgton shall assume all liability for the keeping of said screen at all times free from sticks, leaves and all debris, so that the same will not become clogged and prevent the free running of water through the same; and provided further, that the state shall be liable for only  $\frac{1}{2}$  the cost of said screen.

### RESOLVE, Providing for a Fish Screen at the Outlet of Gardner's Lake at Chase's Mills, in East Machias, Washington County.

**Gardner's lake; screening of. Resolved:** That the sum of \$400 be, and hereby is, appropriated from the funds of the department of inland fisheries and game, for installing a fish screen at the outlet of Gardner's lake at Chase's Mills, in East Machias, Washington county; provided, however, that Gardner's Lake Fish and Gun Club shall assume all liability for main-

taining said screen and keeping said screen free from all sticks, leaves and debris so that the same will not become clogged and prevent the free running of water through the same; and provided further, that the state shall be liable for only  $\frac{1}{2}$  the cost of said screen.

### Chapter 83

**RESOLVE, Providing for a Fish Screen at Worthley Pond, in the Town of Peru, Oxford County.**

Worthley pond; screening of. Resolved: That the sum of \$500 be, and hereby is, appropriated from the funds of the department of inland fisheries and game, for installing a fish screen at the outlet of Worthley pond in the town of Peru, Oxford county; provided, however, that the North Eastern Oxford County Fish and Game Protective Association shall assume all liability for maintaining said screen and keeping said screen free from all sticks, leaves and debris so that the same will not become clogged and prevent the free running of water through the same; and provided further, that the state shall be liable for only  $\frac{1}{2}$  the cost of said screen.

### Chapter 84

**RESOLVE, in Favor of Piscataquis County Fish and Game Association.**

Piscataquis County Fish and Game Association; reimbursed. Resolved: That the sum of \$119.46 be, and hereby is, appropriated from the funds of the department of inland fisheries and game, for installing a fish screen at the outlet of First Davis pond in the town of Guilford in the county of Piscataquis; provided, however, that the Piscataquis County Fish and Game Association shall assume all liability for the keeping of said screen at all times free from sticks, leaves and all debris, so that the same will not become clogged and prevent the free running of water through the same; and provided further, that the state shall be liable for only  $\frac{1}{2}$  the cost of said screen.
