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**RESOLVES, 1951****CHAP. 113**

Island; said sum to be taken from the general highway fund. Any balance of the appropriation remaining unexpended at the end of the fiscal year shall be available for the same purpose in any succeeding fiscal year.

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## Chapter 112

### RESOLVE, Regulating Fishing in Somerset County.

Open season for fishing in Somerset county, regulated. Resolved: That the commissioner of inland fisheries and game be, and hereby is, authorized and directed to issue a rule and regulation to open the season for fishing in Somerset county in open water on and after April 15th; and be it further

Resolved: That the commissioner of inland fisheries and game be, and hereby is, authorized and directed to issue a rule and regulation to establish the daily bag limit of 5 pounds of trout or an aggregate of 7½ pounds of trout, salmon or togue in lakes and ponds in Somerset county, unless a smaller bag limit is otherwise established; and be it further

Resolved: That the commissioner of inland fisheries and game be, and hereby is, authorized and directed to issue a rule and regulation to establish the daily bag limit of 10 fish in East Carry Pond and Middle Carry Pond in Somerset county; and be it further

Resolved: That the commissioner of inland fisheries and game be, and hereby is, authorized and directed to issue a rule and regulation to establish the same open season date in the spring on Moose river, Somerset county, from Brassua dam to Moosehead lake, as is in effect on Moosehead lake, Piscataquis county.

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## Chapter 113

### RESOLVE, Closing Certain Tributaries to Lake Moxie, Somerset County, to All Fishing.

Tributaries to Lake Moxie; closed to fishing. Resolved: That the commissioner of inland fisheries and game be, and hereby is, authorized

and directed to issue a rule and regulation closing all tributaries to Lake Moxie, in the county of Somerset, to all fishing except Alder stream, Big Sandy stream and Baker stream.

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**Chapter 114****RESOLVE, Regulating Fishing in the Fish River Chain of Lakes.**

Fishing in the Fish River Chain of Lakes, regulated. Resolved: That the commissioner of inland fisheries and game be, and hereby is, authorized and directed to issue a rule and regulation closing St. Froid lake, Eagle lake, Mud lake and Cross lake, in the county of Aroostook, to plug or still fishing in more than 25 feet of water from July 15 to September 1.

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**Chapter 115****RESOLVE, Regulating Fishing in Red River and Birch River.**

Fishing in Red river and Birch river, regulated. Resolved: That the commissioner of inland fisheries and game be, and hereby is, authorized and directed to issue a rule and regulation closing to all fishing Red river and Birch river and their tributaries, in the county of Aroostook.

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**Chapter 116****RESOLVE, in Favor of Peter J. Beaulier, of Ashland.**

Peter J. Beaulier; compensated. Resolved: That there be, and hereby is, appropriated the sum of \$1,000 from the general highway fund to be paid to Peter J. Beaulier, of Ashland, as a full and final settlement for his claim against the state for damages to his water supply by salt seepage from winter sand which was stored on his property by the state highway commission.
