## Chapter 129

### RESOLVE, Providing for the Payment of Certain Damages Caused by Protected Wild Animals.

Damages caused by deer and moose to automobiles and crops, provided for. **Resolved:** That there be, and hereby is, appropriated the sum of \$3,667.46 from the funds of the department of inland fisheries and game to be paid to certain persons, as a full and final settlement for their claims against the state for damages to their cars, trucks and crops according to the following list:

## Chapter 130

**RESOLVE, Proposing an Amendment to the Constitution Relating to Voting by Citizens in the Armed Forces and Others Absent or Physically Incapacitated.**

**Constitutional amendment. Resolved:** Two-thirds of each branch of the legislature concurring, that the following amendment to the constitution of this state be proposed:

**Constitution, Art. II, § 4, amended.** Section 4 of article II of the constitution is hereby amended by repealing all after the 1st sentence thereof and inserting in place thereof the following:

'The legislature under proper enactment shall authorize and provide for voting by citizens of the state absent therefrom in the armed forces of the
