Payment of the pensions herein provided to Pauline Dechane, Donald Forbes, Pearl Izetta Harriman, Arthur Wesley Hunt, Phillippa Jandreau, Bernard M. Kelley, Valeda Marie Kennedy, Allen Malcolm, Hilda Malcolm, Ronald Martin Mosher, Katherine Parks, Floyd Poland, shall be made only after a court of competent jurisdiction has determined under the provisions of law the need for the appointment of a conservator or guardian.

Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this resolve shall take effect when approved.

Chapter 168

RESOLVE, Appropriating Moneys to Reactivate Mile Light at Cove Point Gore.

Emergency preamble. Whereas, Cove Point Gore, near Greenville, Piscataquis county, is used as a base for boats and sea planes of the departments of forestry and inland fisheries and game; and

Whereas, navigation to Greenville passes Cove Point Gore; and

Whereas, to protect such navigation it is essential that Mile Light be reactivated to protect both life and property; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore, be it

Mile Light reactivated; appropriation. Resolved: That there be, and hereby is, appropriated from the general fund the sum of \$1,200 to reactivate Mile Light at Cove Point Gore, near Greenville, Piscataquis county; and be it further

Resolved: That the appropriation shall be expended under the direction and supervision of the public utilities commission.

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Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this resolve shall take effect when approved.

Effective May 21, 1951

Chapter 169

RESOLVE, Providing for Certain Construction at the Maine State Airport.

Maine state airport; appropriation for construction. Resolved: That the sum of \$143,000 be, and hereby is, appropriated to be used with matching federal funds for extension of the northwest-southeast runway and lighting system at the state airport, at Augusta, so said airport may be usable and safe for present air traffic.

Effective August 20, 1951

Chapter 170

RESOLVE, to Reimburse Robert Ballard, of Hallowell.

Robert Ballard, compensated. Resolved: That the sum of \$512.30 is hereby appropriated to be paid to Robert Ballard, of Hallowell, in full and final settlement of his claim against the state for damage to his tractor. The said sum shall be taken from the fund for state school for girls' farm operations.

Chapter 171

RESOLVE, Providing for the Payment of Certain Pauper Claims.

Claims, appropriation and payment thereof. Resolved: That there be, and hereby is, appropriated to be paid to the cities, towns, counties and persons hereinafter named, the sums set opposite their respective names, amounting in the aggregate to the sum of \$22,674.14, being a full and final settlement of all claims against the state of Maine as listed herein.
