CHAP. 171

Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this resolve shall take effect when approved.

Effective May 21, 1951

Chapter 169

RESOLVE, Providing for Certain Construction at the Maine State Airport.

Maine state airport; appropriation for construction. Resolved: That the sum of \$143,000 be, and hereby is, appropriated to be used with matching federal funds for extension of the northwest-southeast runway and lighting system at the state airport, at Augusta, so said airport may be usable and safe for present air traffic.

Chapter 170

RESOLVE, to Reimburse Robert Ballard, of Hallowell.

Robert Ballard, compensated. Resolved: That the sum of \$512.30 is hereby appropriated to be paid to Robert Ballard, of Hallowell, in full and final settlement of his claim against the state for damage to his tractor. The said sum shall be taken from the fund for state school for girls' farm operations.

RESOLVE, Providing for the Payment of Certain Pauper Claims.
