RESOLVES, 1951**CHAP. 187**

eral fund the sum of \$1,000 for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1952 for the purpose of providing suitable identification of unmarked graves of deceased veterans of the Spanish American War. Such appropriation shall not lapse, but shall be a continuing carrying account, and shall be expended under the direction of the adjutant-general.

Effective August 20, 1951

Chapter 185

RESOLVE, to Compensate Edwin Blanche of Augusta for Personal Injuries.

Edwin Blanche; compensated. Resolved: That the sum of \$3,000 be, and hereby is, appropriated to be paid Edwin Blanche, of Augusta, as compensation for injuries received in an accident on June 9, 1949, while he was in the employ of the state of Maine; said sum to be paid from the general highway fund of the state.

Effective August 20, 1951

Chapter 186

RESOLVE, in Favor of Emile Couillard, of Auburn.

Emile Couillard; reimbursed. Resolved: That the sum of \$100 be, and hereby is, appropriated from the funds of the state liquor commission to be paid to Emile Couillard, of Auburn, to reimburse him for a retail malt liquor license issued to him and which he is unable to use because of illness.

Chapter 187

RESOLVE, Granting a Pension to Alice B. Grant, of Kittery.

Teacher's pension granted to Alice B. Grant. Resolved: That Alice B. Grant, of Kittery, be given credit for 6 years of teaching service at the U. S. Navy Yard so that she may be entitled to a retirement benefit under the provisions of chapter 60 of the revised statutes.

Effective August 20, 1951
