Sec. 2. R. S., c. 33, § 95, amended. Section 95 of chapter 33 of the revised statutes, as revised, is hereby amended by adding at the end thereof the following paragraph:

'The provisions of this section shall not apply to the propagation of wild hares or rabbits on islands surrounded by open salt water all year.'

Chapter 27

AN ACT to Increase the Salary of Judge of Probate of Hancock County.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 140, § 3, amended. That part of section 3 of chapter 140 of the revised statutes, as amended, which relates to the salary of the judge of probate of Hancock county, is hereby amended to read as follows:

'Hancock, ~~\$2,300~~ \$3,000.'

Chapter 28

AN ACT Relating to Payment to York County Law Library.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 79, § 151, amended. That part of section 151 of chapter 79 of the revised statutes, which relates to York county, as repealed and replaced by chapter 253 of the public laws of 1945, and as amended, is hereby further amended to read as follows:

'York, ~~\$1,750~~ \$2,250.'
