'A state registration certificate for airmen, aircraft and air carriers shall not be effective until in actual possession of the applicant and shall always be carried on the person of the operator or occupant, or in some easily accessible place in or about the aircraft. A state registration certificate for airmen, aircraft and air carriers shall remain in force until the 1st day of April January next following the date of its issue, except that on and after December 25th of each calendar year it shall be lawful to use and display in aircraft, the aircraft and air carrier registration certificate issued for the next succeeding year; provided further that aircraft registrations issued thereon in any calendar year shall be valid for use and display until March 1st of the next calendar year, or until sooner suspended, revoked or cancelled.'
