Chapter 103

AN ACT Relating to Admission to Practice Law.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 93, § 4-A, amended. The 2nd sentence of section 4-A of chapter 93 of the revised statutes, as enacted by chapter 70 of the public laws of 1945, is hereby amended to read as follows:

'Such equivalent preliminary education shall be proved by presenting to said board within 6 10 years after such person receives his discharge from such armed forces, his diploma or certificate of graduation from such secondary school and his honorable discharge from such armed forces.'

Chapter 104

AN ACT Relating to Educational Requirements and Fees for Chiropractors.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. R. S., c. 65, § 3, amended. The 1st sentence of section 3 of chapter 65 of the revised statutes is hereby amended to read as follows:

'Any person to whom a certificate has been granted under the provisions of section 5 shall, on or before the 1st day of June of each year, pay to the secretary of the board a fee of ~~§3~~ \$5, upon payment of which said certificate shall be renewed for 1 year; provided that in addition to the payment of such renewal fee, each licensee so applying for his renewal certificate shall furnish to said board satisfactory evidence that he has attended one of 2 educational programs conducted and supervised by the said board, in the year preceding.'

Sec. 2. R. S., c. 65, § 4, amended. Section 4 of chapter 65 of the revised statutes, as amended, is hereby further amended to read as follows:

'Sec. 4. Examination and registration. Any person, before engaging in the practice of chiropractic in this state, shall make application for a certificate to practice chiropractic to the board on a form prescribed by said board. Said application shall be filed with the secretary of the board at
