Chapter 109

AN ACT to Amend the Exemption in the Sales and Use Tax Law Respecting Hospitals.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. R. S., c. 14-A, § 10, sub-§ XII-A, additional. Section 10 of chapter 14-A of the revised statutes, as enacted by section 1 of chapter 250 of the public laws of 1951, is hereby amended by adding thereto a new subsection to be numbered XII-A, to read as follows:

'XII-A. Sales to proprietors of unincorporated hospitals. Sales to proprietors of unincorporated hospitals of hospital supplies and equipment. By "hospital supplies and equipment" is intended all tangible personal property bought for the care, treatment and housing of patients of the hospital or any other purpose necessarily incident to the operation of the hospital.'

Sec. 2. R. S., c. 14-A, § 10, sub-§ XIII, amended. Subsection XIII of section 10 of chapter 14-A of the revised statutes, as enacted by section 1 of chapter 250 of the public laws of 1951, is hereby amended to read as follows:

'XIII. Hospitals, research centers and churches. Sales to incorporated hospitals, institutions incorporated as non-profit corporations for the sole purpose of conducting medical research, and regularly organized churches or houses of religious worship, excepting ~~such~~ sales, storage or use in activities ~~as~~ which are mainly commercial enterprises.'

Chapter 110

AN ACT to Facilitate Voting by Members of the Armed Forces of the United States.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. R. S., c. 6-A, additional. The revised statutes are hereby amended by adding thereto a new chapter to be numbered 6-A, to read as follows:

CHAPTER 6-A.

VOTING BY ARMED FORCES.
