'No person, firm or corporation shall operate or cause to be operated a shop or establishment where barbering or hairdressing and beauty culture are practiced unless such shop or establishment has been duly licensed. The fee for a license to operate a barber shop shall be \$5 in the first instance and \$3 for each yearly renewal thereof. The license shall run from the 1st day of January in each year for 1 year and the fee shall be payable to the secretary of the board. The fee for a license to operate a beauty shop shall be \$5 in the first instance and \$3 but not exceeding \$5, for each yearly renewal thereof. The license shall run from the 1st day of July in each year for 1 year and the fee shall be payable to the secretary of said board.'

AN ACT Relating to Payments to Somerset County Law Library.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 79, § 151, amended. That part of section 151 of chapter 79 of the revised statutes which relates to Somerset county, as repealed and replaced by chapter 253 of the public laws of 1945, is hereby amended to read as follows:

'Somerset, \$1,500 \$2,500,'

AN ACT Relating to Salaries of Certain County Officers of Sagadahoc County.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. R. S., c. 79, § 6, amended. That part of section 6 of chapter 79 of the revised statutes which relates to the salaries of the county commissioners of Sagadahoc county is hereby amended to read as follows:

'Sagadahoc, \$600 \$720,'

Sec. 2. R. S., c. 79, § 114, amended. That part of section 114 of chapter 79 of the revised statutes which relates to the salary of the clerk of courts of Sagadahoc county, as amended, is hereby further amended to read as follows:

'Sagadahoc, \$2,500 \$3,000,'

Sec. 3. R. S., c. 79, § 269, amended. That part of section 269 of chapter 79 of the revised statutes which relates to clerk hire in county offices in Sagadahoc county, as amended, is hereby further amended to read as follows:

'Sagadahoc county: for clerks in the office of register of deeds, \$2,340 \$2,574; for clerks in the office of register of probate, \$1,716; for clerks in the office of clerk of courts, \$4,560 \$1,716.'

Sec. 4. Retroactive to January 1, 1953. The provisions of this act shall be retroactive to January 1, 1953.

Chapter 136

AN ACT Relating to Manufacturers and Bottlers of Non-Alcoholic Beverages.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 27, § 216, amended. Section 216 of chapter 27 of the revised statutes is hereby amended to read as follows:

'Sec. 216. Manufacturers and bottlers for sale at wholesale of non-alcoholic beverages licensed; fee. No person, firm or corporation within this state shall manufacture or bottle for sale at wholesale any drink product or other non-alcoholic beverage without first having first filed with the commissioner an application for license accompanied with a fee of \$15 and having been issued such license. No person, firm or corporation manufacturing drink product or other non-alcoholic beverage outside this state for retail sale within this state shall sell or offer for sale such drink product without first having first filed with the commissioner an application for license accompanied with a fee of \$15 and having been issued such license. Upon receipt of such application, containing information required by the commissioner and upon being satisfied that the applicant has com-
