207 CHAP. 243

Chapter 242

AN ACT to Enlarge the Old Town Game Preserve and to Create the Orono Game Preserve.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 33, § 128, amended. That part of section 128 of chapter 33 of the revised statutes, as revised, which relates to Old Town Game Preserve, is hereby amended to read as follows:

'Old Town Game Preserve: The following described territory situated in the city of Old Town, in the county of Penobscot; bounded by Stillwater avenue the Orono town line on the south, and Stillwater and Penobscot rivers on the west, north and east.

Orono Game Preserve: That portion of Marsh Island in the town of Orono bounded by the Old Town town line on the north, and Stillwater and Penobscot rivers on the west, south and east, be hereby designated the Orono Game Preserve.'

Chapter 243

AN ACT Creating a Board of Examiners of Psychologists.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 61-A, additional. The revised statutes are hereby amended by adding thereto a new chapter to be numbered 61-A, to read as follows:

'CHAPTER 61-A.

BOARD OF EXAMINERS OF PSYCHOLOGISTS.

Sec. 1. The board. A state board of examiners for the certification of psychologists is hereby created whose duty it shall be to administer the provisions of this chapter and shall hereinafter be called "the board." The board shall be composed of 3 psychologists and appointed by the governor from a list of 5 psychologists recommended by the executive council of the Maine psychological association for initial terms of 1, 2 and 3 years respectively. At the expiration of each of the aforesaid terms a new appoint-
