Chapter 272

AN ACT to Increase the Salary of the County Attorney of Waldo County.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 79, § 130, amended. That part of section 130 of chapter 79 of the revised statutes, as amended, which relates to the salary of county attorney of Waldo county, is hereby further amended to read as follows:

'Waldo, \$1,500 \$2,000,'

Effective August 8, 1953

Chapter 273

AN ACT Relating to Salaries of County Attorney and Assistant County
Attorney of Cumberland County.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 79, § 130, amended. That part of section 130 of chapter 79 of the revised statutes which relates to the salaries of county attorney and assistant county attorney of Cumberland county, as amended, is hereby further amended to read as follows:

'Cumberland, \$3,500 \$4,000; assistant county attorney, \$2,500 \$3,000,'

Chapter 274

AN ACT to Exempt Automobiles Used in Driver Education Program from the Sales and Use Tax.

Emergency preamble. Whereas, the driver education program conducted by the schools of Maine is essential to highway safety, and

Whereas, such program can only be carried on with the voluntary cooperation of automobile dealers, and

Whereas, the cost to such dealers of cooperating in the program has increased to such an extent that if such dealers are required to pay a sales
