Chapter 286

AN ACT Relating to Delisting and Discontinuance of Purchasing Liquor by the Commission.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 57, § 6, sub-§ IV-B, additional. Section 6 of chapter 57 of the revised statutes, as amended, is hereby further amended by adding thereto a new subsection to be numbered IV-B, to read as follows:

'IV-B. Before any item listed by the commission is discontinued or delisted or before the commission issues any order to stop purchases of any item listed they shall give the vendor of such items reasonable notice in writing of their intention to so delist or stop purchase of such items.'

Chapter 287

AN ACT Relating to Requirements of Group Accident and Sickness Insurance Policies.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 56, § 113, sub-§ II, ¶ C, sub-¶ 3, repealed and replaced. Sub-paragraph 3 of paragraph C of subsection II of section 113 of chapter 56 of the revised statutes, as repealed and replaced by chapter 421 of the public laws of 1949, is hereby repealed and the following enacted in place thereof:

3. The policy must cover at date of issue at least 100 persons and not less than an average of 5 persons per employer unit; and if the fund is established by the members of an association of employers the policy may be issued only if

a. Either

1. The participating employers constitute at date of issue at least 60% of those employer members whose employees are not already covered for the same or similar benefits under a plan maintained by their employer, or
