Chapter 375

AN ACT Exempting Ships' Stores from Maine Sales Tax.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 14-A, § 10, sub-§ III-A, additional. Section 10 of chapter 14-A of the revised statutes, as enacted by section 1 of chapter 250 of the public laws of 1951, is hereby amended by adding thereto a new subsection to be numbered III-A, to read as follows:

'III-A. Ships' stores. Sale of cabin, deck and engine supplies to ships engaged in transporting cargo or passengers for hire in interstate or foreign commerce, not to include fuel and bunkering oil.'

Chapter 376

AN ACT Relating to the Salary of the Reporter of Decisions.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. R. S., c. 92, § 1, amended. Section 1 of chapter 92 of the revised statutes is hereby amended to read as follows:

'Sec. 1. Reporter; appointment and tenure of office; salary. The governor with the advice and consent of the council shall, in case of a vacancy, appoint a person learned in the law, to be reporter of the decisions of the law court, who shall hold his office during the pleasure of the executive. He shall receive an annual salary of ~~\$2,000~~ \$2,500.'

Sec. 2. Appropriation. There is hereby appropriated from the general fund the sum of \$500 for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1954 and \$500 for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1955 to carry out the purposes of this act.
