Chapter 59

AN ACT Increasing the Salary of the Recorder of the Portland Municipal Court.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

P. & S. L., 1887, c. 274, § 1, amended. Section 1 of chapter 274 of the private and special laws of 1887, as amended by chapter 156 of the private and special laws of 1949, is hereby further amended to read as follows:

'Sec. 1. Salary of recorder. The salary of the recorder of the municipal court for the city of Portland shall be ~~\$2,700~~ \$3,500 per annum, which shall be in full for all services, and it shall be the duty of said recorder to make and present all copies of libels and monitions in liquor cases.'

Chapter 60

AN ACT to Increase the Salary of the Judge of the Westbrook Municipal Court.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

P. & S. L., 1909, c. 282, § 2, amended. Section 2 of chapter 282 of the private and special laws of 1909, as amended, is hereby further amended to read as follows:

'Sec. 2. Salary of judge. The judge of said court shall receive a salary of ~~\$1,500~~ \$2,500 per year, to be paid to him in quarterly payments from the county treasury of the county of Cumberland, which shall be in full for all his services as judge. All blanks, civil and criminal dockets and record books required by said court shall be furnished by the county of Cumberland.'
