Chapter 69

AN ACT Relating to Adoption of a Certain Child.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Adoption of a certain child. The male child, born July 9, 1951, and now in the physical custody of Millard P. and Helen McCaslin, of Portland, husband and wife, is declared to be adopted by the said Millard P. and Helen McCaslin and shall henceforth bear the name of Barry Charles McCaslin and shall have the same relation to the said Millard P. and Helen McCaslin, in all respects, as though he had been born to them as their own child, including the right of inheritance.

Chapter 70

AN ACT Relating to the Digging of Marine Worms in Alna, Edgecomb, Newcastle and Wiscasset.

Emergency preamble. Whereas, acts of the legislature become effective 90 days after adjournment; and

Whereas, it is vitally necessary to conserve the flats in Alna, Edgecomb, Newcastle and Wiscasset; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the legislature these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore,

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. Digging of marine worms in the towns of Alna, Edgecomb, Newcastle and Wiscasset. No person shall dig or take marine worms within
