Chapter 15

RESOLVE, Regulating the Taking of Smelts in Oxford County.

Taking of Smelts in Oxford county, regulated. Resolved: That the commissioner of inland fisheries and game be, and hereby is, authorized and directed to issue a rule and regulation opening the fishing season for smelts in the county of Oxford on April 1st.

Effective August 8, 1953

Chapter 16

RESOLVE, Authorizing the Forest Commissioner to Convey the Interest of the State (Maine Forestry District) in a Lot of Land in the Town of Brownville.

Authorizing forest commissioner to convey certain land. Resolved: That the forest commissioner be, and hereby is, authorized and directed to convey the interest of the state of Maine (Maine Forestry District) in a lot of land in the town of Brownville, to the highest bidder, but not less than \$100, the income to be credited to the Maine Forestry District.

Effective August 8, 1953

Chapter 17

RESOLVE, Authorizing the Forest Commissioner to Convey the Interest of the State in Lot 102, in St. Agatha.

Forest commissioner to convey certain land. Resolved: That the forest commissioner be, and hereby is, authorized and directed to convey the interest of the state of Maine, in and to, lot 102, in St. Agatha, to the highest bidder, but not less than \$200.

RESOLVE, Regulating Fishing in the Kennebec River.

Fishing in Kennebec River, regulated. Resolved: That the commissioner of inland fisheries and game be, and hereby is, authorized and directed to issue a rule and regulation opening the East Branch of the
