## RESOLVES, 1953

## CHAP. 36

Whereas, in the judgment of the legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore, be it

**County taxes apportioned. Resolved:** That the sum appearing opposite to the names of the counties in the following schedule is hereby granted as a tax on each county respectively to be appropriated, assessed, collected and applied to the purpose of paying the debts and necessary expenses of the same and for other purposes of law, for the years 1953 and 1954.

**Chapter 37****RESOLVE, Regulating Fishing in Warren Pond, York County.**

Fishing in Warren pond, regulated. **Resolved:** That the commissioner of inland fisheries and game be, and hereby is, authorized and directed to issue a rule and regulation to close Warren Pond, York county, to ice fishing and to the use of live fish bait; and to issue a rule and regulation limiting fishing in said pond to a limit of 5 fish per day per person.

**Chapter 38****RESOLVE, Authorizing the Commissioner of Inland Fisheries and Game to Convey a Right of Way over State Owned Land in Littleton.**

Commissioner of inland fisheries and game to convey a right of way over certain land. **Resolved:** That the commissioner of inland fisheries and game be, and hereby is, authorized and directed on behalf of the state of Maine to convey to Mary S. Hammond, of Littleton, Aroostook county, a right of way over land in said Littleton owned by the state of Maine and used in connection with the Littleton fish hatchery, the right of way being the same described in a reservation in a deed from Mary S. Hammond to the state of Maine, dated October 23, 1952, and recorded in volume 646 at page 187 in the Aroostook registry of deeds at Houlton.
