Chapter 43

RESOLVE, Regulating Fishing in Rancourt Pond, Somerset County.

Rancourt pond; fishing regulated. Resolved: That the commissioner of inland fisheries and game be, and hereby is, authorized and directed to issue a rule and regulation to open Rancourt pond, Somerset county, to fly fishing only.

Chapter 44

RESOLVE, Regulating Fishing in Ell Pond, York County.

Ell pond; fishing regulated. Resolved: That the commissioner of inland fisheries and game be, and hereby is, authorized and directed to issue a rule and regulation closing Ell pond in the towns of Sanford and Wells, York county, to ice fishing; and restricting other fishing therein to the ordinary manner of casting with unbaited artificial flies or by trolling with unbaited artificial flies or lures, with a limit of 5 fish per person per day.

Chapter 45

RESOLVE, Opening Certain Waters in Sagadahoc County to Ice Fishing.

Certain waters in Sagadahoc county opened to ice fishing. Resolved: That the commissioner of inland fisheries and game be, and hereby is, authorized and directed to issue a rule and regulation opening Sewall pond in Arrowsic; Lily pond in Bath and West Bath; Houghton pond in West Bath; Blaisdell pond in Phippsburg; Duley pond in Phippsburg and Mose pond in Georgetown; all in the county of Sagadahoc, to ice fishing.

Chapter 46

RESOLVE, in Favor of the Town of Sullivan.

Town of Sullivan; reimbursed. Resolved: That there be, and hereby is, appropriated from the general highway fund the sum of \$970 to be paid

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to the town of Sullivan in settlement of the claim against the state for the state's share of snow removal expense incurred during 1951 and 1952.

RESOLVE, Regulating Ice Fishing in Coffee Pond, Cumberland County.

Ice fishing in Coffee pond, regulated. **Resolved:** That the commissioner of inland fisheries and game be, and hereby is, authorized and directed to issue a rule and regulation to close Coffee pond in Cumberland county to ice fishing.

Chapter 48

RESOLVE, Authorizing the Commissioner of Education to Convey Certain Interest of the State to the Unity Library Association.

Authorizing commissioner of education to convey certain property. **Resolved:** That the commissioner of education be, and hereby is, authorized and directed to convey the interest of the state of Maine in an abandoned school building in Unity Plantation to the Unity Library Association.

Chapter 49

RESOLVE, in Favor of Mrs. Carol Hapworth of Winslow.

Carol Hapworth; compensated. **Resolved:** That there be, and hereby is, appropriated the sum of \$150 to be paid to Mrs. Carol Hapworth, of Winslow, as a full and final settlement for her claim against the state for loss of one cow which died as a result of a Bang's disease and T. B. test; said sum to be paid from the funds of the department of agriculture.
