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### Chapter 47

**RESOLVE, Regulating Ice Fishing in Coffee Pond, Cumberland County.**

Ice fishing in Coffee pond, regulated. **Resolved:** That the commissioner of inland fisheries and game be, and hereby is, authorized and directed to issue a rule and regulation to close Coffee pond in Cumberland county to ice fishing.

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### Chapter 48

**RESOLVE, Authorizing the Commissioner of Education to Convey Certain Interest of the State to the Unity Library Association.**

Authorizing commissioner of education to convey certain property. **Resolved:** That the commissioner of education be, and hereby is, authorized and directed to convey the interest of the state of Maine in an abandoned school building in Unity Plantation to the Unity Library Association.

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### Chapter 49

**RESOLVE, in Favor of Mrs. Carol Hapworth of Winslow.**

Carol Hapworth; compensated. **Resolved:** That there be, and hereby is, appropriated the sum of \$150 to be paid to Mrs. Carol Hapworth, of Winslow, as a full and final settlement for her claim against the state for loss of one cow which died as a result of a Bang's disease and T. B. test; said sum to be paid from the funds of the department of agriculture.
