Chapter 50

RESOLVE, in Favor of Cook & Company, Inc.

Cook & Company, Inc.; reimbursed. Resolved: That there be, and hereby is, appropriated the sum of \$1,122.90 to be paid to Cook and Company, Inc. as a full and final settlement of their claim against the state for refund of gasoline tax due them for the period from June 30, 1950 to June 30, 1951; said sum to be paid from the general highway fund.

RESOLVE, in Favor of the Town of Bingham.

Town of Bingham; appropriation for. Resolved: That there be, and hereby is, appropriated the sum of \$350 from the funds of the forestry department to be paid to the town of Bingham in payment for fighting fire in the unorganized township of Concord.

RESOLVE, Relating to the Schoolhouse in Indian Township, Near Princeton.

Schoolhouse in Indian Township near Pleasant Point; jurisdiction of. Resolved: That the responsibility for the maintenance, repair and control of the old schoolhouse in Indian Township near Princeton, which is now in the jurisdiction of the department of education, be and hereby is transferred to the department of health and welfare.
