CHAP. 91

**Resolved:** That this appropriation shall not lapse but remain a continuing carrying account until the purposes of this resolve have been accomplished.

## Chapter 89

**RESOLVE, in Favor of George L. McLellan, of Lamoine.**

**George L. McLellan; appropriation for. Resolved:** That there be, and hereby is, appropriated from the general highway fund the sum of \$50 to be paid to George L. McLellan, of Lamoine, as a full and final settlement of his claim against the state for damage to his property by the state highway commission.

## Chapter 90

**RESOLVE, Regulating White Perch Fishing in Lake Auburn, Sabattus Pond and Little Sabattus Pond.**

**Lake Auburn; fishing for white perch regulated. Resolved:** That the commissioner of inland fisheries and game be, and hereby is, authorized and directed to issue a rule and regulation providing that there shall be no bag limit or size limit on white perch taken in Lake Auburn, Sabattus pond in the towns of Greene, Wales and Webster and Little Sabattus pond in the town of Greene, county of Androscoggin; and be it further

**Resolved:** That the provisions of this resolve shall be in effect as an experiment in the calendar years 1954 and 1955.

## Chapter 91

**RESOLVE, Relating to Construction of a Road and Terminal in City of Rockland.**

**Emergency preamble.** Whereas, under the provisions of chapter 176 of the resolves of 1951, certain state moneys were appropriated for a road and terminal in the city of Rockland and such appropriation was to be available until June 30, 1953; and
