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**CHAP. 137****RESOLVES, 1953**

the Deaf. Such expenditure shall be as recommended by the commissioner of institutional service and approved by the governor and council. It is the intent of the legislature that the sum appropriated herein shall serve to augment the sums already donated to the state in the generous gifts of ex-Governor Baxter and accepted by an appreciative legislature, to the end that new and improved facilities for the State School for the Deaf may be erected on Mackworth Island in the town of Falmouth.

This appropriation shall not lapse but shall remain a carrying balance until the purposes of this act have been accomplished; and be it further

**Resolved:** The governor and council are authorized to sell such property as is now owned by the state and used for the existing State School for the Deaf in Portland. Proceeds from such sale shall augment the appropriation provided for herein and shall be used exactly as though it had been a part of the above said appropriation.

## Chapter 136

**RESOLVE, in Favor of Knox Memorial Association, Inc. for Support and Maintenance of "Montpelier."**

**Knox Memorial Association, Inc.; appropriation for. Resolved:** That there be, and hereby is, appropriated in favor of Knox Memorial Association, Inc., the sum of \$1,000 for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1954, and the sum of \$1,000 for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1955, to aid in the support and maintenance of "Montpelier," replica of the home of Major General Henry Knox, located at Thomaston, Maine.
