## Chapter 168

### RESOLVE, in Favor of a Retirement Allowance for Annie Pierce of Weeks Mills.

**Annie Pierce; retirement allowance. Resolved:** That a retirement allowance of \$60.69 per month be, and hereby is, granted to Annie Pierce of Weeks Mills, to be paid monthly from the funds of the Maine state retirement system. Such retirement allowance shall be retroactive to August 20, 1951 and shall continue during her life. Such retirement allowance shall not be payable until the said Annie Pierce has paid to the Maine retirement system the sum of \$1,392.02.

## Chapter 169

### RESOLVE, in Favor of Mrs. Ruth Spear Sturtevant, of Rockland.

**Pension granted to Mrs. Ruth Spear Sturtevant, of Rockland. Resolved:** That Mrs. Ruth Spear Sturtevant, of Rockland, be paid a retirement benefit under the provisions of the Maine State Retirement System based on 25 years of teaching service, to be paid monthly from the funds of the Maine State Retirement System.

## Chapter 170

### RESOLVE, in Favor of Frank B. Adams of Thomaston.

**Frank B. Adams; retirement benefit increased. Resolved:** That Frank B. Adams of Thomaston be granted sufficient years of creditable service to enable him to qualify for half-pay benefits under the provisions of subsection IV of section 6-A of chapter 60 of the revised statutes.

Effective August 8, 1953
