Chapter 225

AN ACT Relating to Payments to Knox County Law Library.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 89, § 135, amended. That part of section 135 of chapter 89 of the revised statutes which relates to the Knox county law library is hereby amended to read as follows:

'Knox, ~~§1,000~~ \$1,500.'

Chapter 226

AN ACT Relative to the Number of Employees Under Group Accident and Sickness Insurance Policies.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 60, § 120, sub-§ II, ¶ A, sub-¶ 3, amended. Subparagraph 3 of paragraph A of subsection II of section 120 of chapter 60 of the revised statutes is hereby amended to read as follows:

'3. The policy must cover at least ~~25~~ 10 employees at date of issue.'

Chapter 227

AN ACT Relating to Bonds to Towns for License to Build Fish Weirs.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 98, § 7, amended. The 3rd sentence of section 7 of chapter 98 of the revised statutes is hereby amended to read as follows:

'If, upon such examination and hearing of all parties interested, said officers decide that such erection or extension would not be an obstruction to navigation or injury to the rights of others, and determine to allow the same, they shall issue a license under their hands to the applicant, authorizing him to make such an erection or extension, and to maintain the same within the limits mentioned in such license; the applicant for license to build or extend a fish weir or trap as aforesaid shall first give bond to the town, ~~without sureties, in the sum of \$100~~ with sureties, in the sum of \$500, conditioned that upon the termination of such license he shall remove all stakes and brush from the location therein described.'
