suance of a new license or registration being contingent upon the furnishing of security of or proof of financial responsibility, and who during such suspension or revocation or in the absence of full authorization from the Secretary shall drive any motor vehicle, trailer or semi-trailer upon any highway or knowingly permits any motor vehicle, trailer or semi-trailer owned by such person to be operated by another upon any highway, except as permitted under the provisions of sections 75 to 82, inclusive, shall be punished by imprisonment for not more than 6 months, or by a fine of not more than \$500, or by both such fine and imprisonment. Where any person is required under sections 75 to 82, inclusive, to maintain proof of financial responsibility, the Secretary of State may issue a restricted license to such person, authorizing the operation of any motor vehicle, trailer or semi-trailer so long as the owner thereof shall maintain proof of financial responsibility.'

Chapter 396

AN ACT Relating to Compensation of Boards of Registration in Cities of 39,000 Inhabitants or More.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. R. S., c. 3, § 13, amended. The 2nd paragraph of section 13 of chapter 3 of the revised statutes is hereby amended to read as follows:

'In cities of 39,000 inhabitants or more and less than 50,000 inhabitants, the chairman of the board shall receive \$2,850 \$3,050 per year and the other 2 members of the board shall receive \$2,500 per year and such additional amounts as may be authorized by the municipal officers or Board of Finance.'

Sec. 2. R. S., c. 3, § 13, amended. Section 13 of chapter 3 of the revised statutes is hereby amended by adding at the end thereof a new paragraph, to read as follows:

'In cities of 50,000 inhabitants or more, the chairman of the board shall receive \$3,150 per year and the other 2 members of the board shall receive \$2,800 per year and such additional amounts as may be authorized by the municipal officers.'

AN ACT Relating to Publication of Specimen Ballots.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 5, § 2, amended. The second sentence of section 2 of chapter 5 of the revised statutes is hereby amended to read as follows:

'The Secretary of State shall likewise cause to be published prior to the day of any such election, in at least 2 newspapers, if there be so many printed or pub-
