498 COMPACT RATIFIED FOR N. E. BOARD OF HIGHER EDUCATION CHAP. 441 PUBLIC LAWS, 1955

this Compact shall be by the same authority which executed it, by sending 6 months' notice in writing of its intention to withdraw from the Compact to the other states party hereto. The duties and obligations of a renouncing state under Article 7 hereof shall continue as to parolees and probationers residing therein at the time of withdrawal until retaken or finally discharged. Supplementary agreements entered into under Article 10 hereof shall be subject to renunciation as provided by such supplementary agreements, and shall not be subject to the 6 months' renunciation notice of the present Article.

Article 15. Severability. That the provisions of this Compact shall be severable and if any phrase, clause, sentence or provision of this Compact is declared to be contrary to the constitution of any participating state or of the United States or the applicability thereof to any government, agency, person or circumstances is held invalid, the validity of the remainder of this Compact and the applicability thereof to any government, agency, person or circumstance shall not be affected thereby. If this Compact shall be held contrary to the constitution of any state participating therein, the Compact shall remain in full force and effect as to the remaining states and in full force and effect as to the state affected as to all severable matters.'

AN ACT Increasing Salaries of County Attorney and Assistant County Attorney of Penobscot County.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 89, § 114, amended. That part of section 114 of chapter 89 of the revised statutes, which relates to the salaries of the county attorney and assistant county attorney of Penobscot county, is hereby amended to read as follows:

'Penobscot, \$3,000 \$3,500; assistant county attorney, \$2,000 \$2,500,'

Chapter 441

AN ACT Ratifying a Proposed Compact Between the State of Maine and Certain Other States Providing for the Establishment of the New England Board of Higher Education.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. I. R. S., c. 4I-A, additional. The revised statutes are hereby amended by adding thereto a new chapter to be numbered 4I-A, to read as follows:

'CHAPTER 41-A.

NEW ENGLAND BOARD OF HIGHER EDUCATION.
