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'Oxford county: for clerks in the office of the register of deeds, ~~\$3,500~~ \$4,000; for clerks in the office of the register of probate, ~~\$1,600~~ \$2,000; for clerks in the office of clerk of courts, ~~\$1,600~~ \$2,000.'

Sec. 8. R. S., c. 153, § 3, amended. That part of section 3 of chapter 153 of the revised statutes which relates to the salary of the judge of probate of Oxford county is hereby amended to read as follows:

'Oxford, ~~\$2,000~~ \$3,800.'

Sec. 9. R. S., c. 153, § 22, amended. That part of section 22 of chapter 153 of the revised statutes which relates to the salary of the register of probate of Oxford county is hereby amended to read as follows:

'Oxford, ~~\$2,350~~ \$3,300.'

## Chapter 460

AN ACT Providing for a Record of Veterans of World War II and Korean Campaign by Division of Veterans Affairs.

*Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:*

Sec. 1. R. S., c. 26, § 3, sub-§ V, additional. Section 3 of chapter 26 of the revised statutes is hereby amended by adding thereto a subsection to be numbered V, to read as follows:

'V. Establish and maintain a permanent record of all members of the armed services from Maine who served in World War II and the Korean Campaign.'

Sec. 2. Appropriation. There is hereby appropriated from the general fund the sum of \$6,000 for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1956 and \$6,000 for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1957 to carry out the purposes of this act. Such appropriation shall not lapse but shall remain a continuing carrying account until the purposes of this act shall have been accomplished.

## Chapter 461

AN ACT Providing for the Uniform Trust Receipts Act.

*Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:*

R. S., c. 189, additional. The revised statutes are hereby amended by adding thereto a new chapter to be numbered 189 to read as follows:
