Chapter 1

RESOLVE, Repealing the Rule and Regulation Regulating the Taking of Crabs in Cumberland County.

Emergency preamble. Whereas chapter 78 of the resolves of 1951 was passed as a conservation measure for the taking of crabs in Cumberland County; and

Whereas, such resolve has failed in its original purpose and is creating a hardship on the people of Cumberland County; and

Whereas, the following resolve is necessary to protect the people in Cumberland County in their endeavor to earn a livelihood; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the constitution of Maine, and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore, be it

Resolves, 1951, c. 78, repealed. Resolved: That chapter 78 of the resolves of 1951 be, and hereby is, repealed, as follows:

'Rule and regulation. That the commissioner of sea and shore fisheries be, and hereby is, authorized and directed to issue a rule and regulation to prohibit fishing for, taking or eatching crabs in any manner in the county of Cumberland from December 15th to March 15th, inclusive.'

Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this resolve shall take effect when approved.
