CHAP. 53

RESOLVES, 1955

Construct an additional water storage unit	\$7,700
Install one diesel powered water pump	4,000
Renew power line to pump house	13,000
Heat exchange for boiler feed water	14,500
Additional funds to complete kitchen	14,000'

The appropriation provided by this resolve shall not lapse but shall remain a continuing carrying account until the purposes of this resolve have been accomplished.

Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this resolve shall take effect when approved.

Chapter 51

RESOLVE, Opening Part of Passagassawaukeag River for Salt Water Smelt Fishing.

Passagassawaukeag River open for smelt fishing. **Resolved:** That the Commissioner of Sea and Shore Fisheries be and hereby is authorized and directed to issue a rule and regulation opening Passagassawaukeag River, Waldo County, from the head of the tide to 2,000 feet below the Memorial Bridge for the commercial fishing for salt water smelts.

Chapter 52

RESOLVE, Closing Alewife Pond in Kennebunk to Ice Fishing.

Alewife Pond in Kennebunk; closed to ice fishing. **Resolved:** That the Commissioner of Inland Fisheries and Game be, and hereby is, authorized and directed to issue a rule and regulation closing Alewife Pond in Kennebunk, York county, to ice fishing.

RESOLVE, Regulating Taking of Alewives from Dennyville River, Washington County.

Taking of alewives from Dennyville River, regulated. **Resolved:** That the Commissioner of Inland Fisheries and Game be, and hereby is, authorized to issue

a rule and regulation granting to the municipal officers of the town of Meddybemps, Washington county, the right to take alewives from Dennysville river, in that part located in the town of Meddybemps, under such terms, rules and regulations, as the Commissioner of Inland Fisheries and Game may establish.

Chapter 54

RESOLVE, Relating to Night Fishing for Smelts in Long Lake, Aroostook County.

Fishing for smelts in Long Lake, regulated. Resolved: That the Commissioner of Inland Fisheries and Game be, and hereby is, authorized and directed to issue a rule and regulation permitting night fishing for smelts in Long Lake in St. Agatha, Frenchville, Madawaska, Township 17 Range 3 and Township 17 Range 4 in Aroostook County from ice-in to March 31st of each year.

Chapter 55

RESOLVE, Regulating Ice Fishing in Twitchell Pond, Oxford County.

Fishing in Twitchell Pond, regulated. Resolved: That the Commissioner of Inland Fisheries and Game be, and hereby is, authorized and directed to issue a rule and regulation opening Twitchell Pond, Oxford county, to ice fishing from ice-in to March 31st of each year.

Chapter 56

RESOLVE, Authorizing Commissioner of Institutional Service to Convey to Portland Water District a Right-of-Way for a Pipeline from the Falmouth Shore to Mackworth Island in Portland Harbor, Casco Bay.

Commissioner of Institutional Service, in name of State of Maine, authorized to convey a certain right-of-way. Resolved: That the Commissioner of Institutional Service, in the name of the State of Maine, be, and hereby is, authorized and directed to convey by quit claim deed to Portland Water District, its successors and assigns, the right perpetually to enter at any and all times upon a strip of land and flats owned by the State of Maine and situated in the town of Falmouth, in the county of Cumberland and State of Maine, said strip being shown on a plan made by Portland Water District entitled "Plan of Right-of-Way from Falmouth Shore to Mackworth Island for Submarine Water Main," dated March 16, 1955, said plan being now on file in the office of the Secretary of State, to which plan reference is hereby made for a more particular description of said strip, and to construct and perpetually maintain through and
