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### Chapter 137

**RESOLVE, to Reimburse Alexander Belanger of Lewiston for Damages by State Ward.**

Alexander Belanger; reimbursed. Resolved: That there be, and hereby is, appropriated from the general fund of the state the sum of \$66.57 to be paid to Alexander Belanger of Lewiston as a full and final settlement of his claim against the state for damage done to his tractor by a state ward.

Effective August 20, 1955

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### Chapter 138

**RESOLVE, in Favor of Fred Kinner of Lewiston.**

Fred Kinner; reimbursed. Resolved: That there be, and hereby is, appropriated from the general fund of the state the sum of \$185.85 to be paid to Fred Kinner of Lewiston, as a full and final settlement of his claim against the State, for damage done to his barn by a state ward.

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### Chapter 139

**RESOLVE, in Favor of Eugene F. Young of South Portland.**

Eugene F. Young; reimbursed. Resolved: That there be, and hereby is, appropriated from the general fund of the State the sum of \$25 to be paid to Eugene F. Young, of South Portland, as a full and final settlement of his claim against the State, for damage done and goods taken by a boy from the State School for Boys.

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### Chapter 140

**RESOLVE, Appropriating Monies for Civil Defense Matching Funds.**

**Emergency preamble.** Whereas, acts of the legislature do not become effective until 90 days after the legislature has adjourned; and

Whereas, available funds for Civil Defense are insufficient for matching Federal funds for the purchase of necessary equipment; and

Whereas, the following legislation is necessary to provide sufficient funds to match money made available from the Federal Government; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the constitution of Maine, and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore, be it

**Monies for Civil Defense matching funds; appropriated. Resolved:** That there be, and hereby is, appropriated from the unappropriated surplus of the general fund, to the Department of Civil Defense and Public Safety the sum of \$95,377.40 to match Federal funds for needed equipment; and be it further

**Resolved:** That said appropriation shall not lapse but shall remain a continuing carrying account.

**Emergency clause:** In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this resolve shall take effect when approved.

## Chapter 141

**RESOLVE, in Favor of the Maine Historical Society.**

**Maine Historical Society; appropriation for. Resolved:** That there be, and hereby is, appropriated from the general fund of the state in favor of the Maine Historical Society, the sum of \$2,500 for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1956; and the sum of \$2,500 for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1957; the same to be paid in quarterly payments commencing on October 1, 1955.

## Chapter 142

**RESOLVE, Appropriating Funds for the Perambulation of the Maine-New Hampshire Boundary Line.**

**Perambulation of Maine-New Hampshire Boundary line; appropriation. Resolved:** That there be and is hereby appropriated from the unappropriated surplus of the general fund the sum of \$5,000 to carry out the provisions of Chapter 179 of the Public Laws of 1937.

## Chapter 143

**RESOLVE, Authorizing the Forest Commissioner to Cut Certain Growth on Route 17.**

**Cutting of certain growth on Route 17 authorized. Resolved:** That the Forest Commissioner be, and hereby is, authorized and directed to trim the growth
