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## Chapter 25

AN ACT Relating to Military Leave Credits under State Personnel Law.

*Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:*

R. S., c. 63, § 28, amended. Section 28 of chapter 63 of the Revised Statutes is hereby amended by adding at the end thereof, a new paragraph, to read as follows:

'No credits toward retirement under the State Retirement System, nor vacation or sick leave accumulation shall be allowed beyond the period of first enlistment or induction in said armed forces of the United States unless the individual involved is required to remain in or return to military service beyond the first period of service under some mandatory provision.'

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## Chapter 26

AN ACT Relating to Military Leave Credits under State Retirement System.

*Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:*

R. S., c. 63-A, § 3, amended. Section 3 of chapter 63-A of the Revised Statutes, as enacted by section one of chapter 417 of the public laws of 1955, is hereby amended by adding to subsection VI, a new sentence, to read as follows:

'No such credits shall be allowed to count toward a state retirement benefit beyond the period of first enlistment or induction into the said armed forces unless the individual involved is compelled to continue service under some mandatory provision.'

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## Chapter 27

AN ACT Relating to Depositing of Domestic Fowl to Cause Nuisance.

*Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:*

R. S., c. 25, § 87, amended. Section 87 of chapter 25 of the Revised Statutes is hereby amended to read as follows:

'Sec. 87. Depositing carcass of dead animal or fowl where it may cause nuisance. Whoever personally or through the agency of another leaves or deposits the carcass of a dead horse, cow, sheep, hog or of any ~~other of the larger~~ domestic animals or domestic fowl or parts thereof in any place where it may cause a nuisance shall, upon receiving a notice to that effect from the local health officer, promptly remove, bury or otherwise dispose of such carcass ~~and if~~. If he fails to do so within such time as may be prescribed by the local health officer,

and in such manner as may be satisfactory to such health officer, he shall be punished by a fine of not less than ~~5~~ \$10 nor more than ~~25~~ \$100, or by imprisonment for not more than ~~1~~ ~~month~~ 3 months.'

## Chapter 28

AN ACT Relating to Right of Appeal Under Labor and Industry Chapter.

*Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:*

R. S., c. 30, § 164, additional. Chapter 30 of the Revised Statutes is hereby amended by adding at the end thereof a new section to be numbered 164, to read as follows:

### 'Appeals.

Sec. 164. Appeals. Any order by a board created and established under this chapter, or any rule, regulation, determination or declaration formulated by such board or by the Commissioner, shall be subject to review by a Justice of the Superior Court, in term time or vacation, by an appeal taken within 30 days after the effective date of such rule, regulation, determination or declaration to the Superior Court, held in or for the county in which the operation is located, at the instance of any party in interest and aggrieved by said rule, regulation, determination or declaration. Such appeal shall be prosecuted by petition. Upon the filing thereof the Court in term time or a Justice thereof in vacation shall order notice thereof. Upon the evidence and after hearing, which shall be held not less than 7 days after notice thereof, the Court or a Justice thereof may modify, affirm or reverse the rule, regulation, determination or declaration in whole or in part in accordance with law and the weight of the evidence. The Court or a Justice thereof shall, upon hearing, determine whether the filing of the appeal shall operate as a stay of any rule, regulation, determination or declaration pending the final determination of the appeal, and may impose such terms and conditions as may be deemed proper.'

## Chapter 29

AN ACT Relating to Employment of Females.

*Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:*

R. S., c. 30, § 30, amended. Section 30 of chapter 30 of the Revised Statutes, as repealed and replaced by section 1 of chapter 348 of the public laws of 1955, is hereby amended to read as follows:

'Sec. 30. Females not to be employed more than 9 hours a day. No female shall knowingly be employed or accept employment in any of one or more workshops, factories, manufacturing, mechanical or mercantile establishments, beauty parlors, hotels, commercial places of amusement, restaurants, dairies,
