Sec. 15. R. S., c. 38, § 128, amended. Section 128 of chapter 38 of the Revised Statutes, as revised, is hereby amended to read as follows:

'Sec. 128. Certificate of Commissioner, Deputy Commissioner or Chief Coastal Warden admissible in evidence. Any certificate of the Commissioner, Deputy Commissioner or Chief Coastal Warden in regard to the records of his office shall be admissible in evidence in all prosecutions under the provisions of this chapter.'

Chapter 31

AN ACT Relating to Display of Licenses of Real Estate Salesmen.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 84, § 7, amended. The last sentence of the 1st paragraph of section 7 of chapter 84 of the Revised Statutes is hereby amended to read as follows:

'It shall be the duty of each real estate broker to display conspicuously his license and the licenses of all his salesmen in his place of business.'

Chapter 32

AN ACT Relating to Definition of Real Estate Brokers.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 84, § 2, sub-§ I, amended. Subsection I of section 2 of chapter 84 of the Revised Statutes, as amended by section 2 of chapter 299 of the public laws of 1955, is hereby further amended by adding at the end thereof a new paragraph to read as follows:

'A "real estate broker" shall also include any person, firm, partnership, association or corporation who engages in the business, for a fee, in connection with any contract whereby he undertakes to promote the sale of real estate through the listing of such property in a publication, issued primarily for such purpose or for referral of information concerning properties to licensed real estate brokers, or both.'

AN ACT Relating to Powers of Directors of Credit Unions.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 55, § 16, amended. The fourth sentence of section 16 of chapter 55 of the Revised Statutes is hereby amended to read as follows:
