Chapter 161

AN ACT Permitting Caucus for Penobscot Indians.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 25, § 370, amended. Section 370 of chapter 25 of the Revised Statutes is hereby amended by adding a new paragraph at the end thereof to read as follows:

'On the first Tuesday of August biennially on the even-numbered years, the Penobscot Indians shall hold a caucus for the purpose of nominating candidates to be elected as provided in this section.'

Chapter 162

AN ACT Relating to Income from Sale of Timber on Indian Township.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 25, § 373, amended. The 3rd sentence of section 373 of chapter 25 of the Revised Statutes is hereby amended to read as follows:

'The net proceeds from such sales shall be placed in the Passamaquoddy tribe trust funds until a sum equal to that used from said trust funds for housing has been placed therein then the net proceeds shall be set up in the State Treasury as an improvement fund for the reservation of the Passamaquoddy tribe of Indians to be expended with the approval and under the direction of the Department; ~~provided that in~~ In the event the balance in said improvement fund shall at the end of any fiscal year exceed the sum of \$10,000, the excess over \$10,000 shall be added to the permanent trust funds of said tribe.'

Chapter 163

AN ACT Relating to Dumping Rubbish and Bottles on Highways from Motor Vehicles.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 137, § 31, amended. Section 31 of chapter 137 of the Revised Statutes, as amended by section 2 of chapter 206 of the public laws of 1955, is hereby further amended to read as follows:

'Sec. 31. Throwing of bottles, etc., on highways. Whoever throws or deposits on any public way or on land within the bounds of such way or property adjacent thereto any bottles or metal cans, except in proper containers placed for rubbish collection and removal, shall be punished by a fine of not more than
