CHAP. 215

#### Chapter 214

AN ACT Relating to Examinations and Instruction Permits for Motor Vehicle Licenses.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. R. S., c. 22, § 60, amended. The 5th sentence of section 60 of chapter 22 of the Revised Statutes is hereby amended to read as follows:

'Any person required to take an examination to qualify him to operate a motor vehicle shall pay a fee of \$\frac{\pi}{2}\$ to the Secretary of State, which fee shall be paid before the examination is given and shall be applied by him for defraying the expense of giving such examination; except that any person required to take such examination because of advanced age or physical disability shall not be required to pay said examination fee of \$\frac{\pi}{2}\$ \$2.'

Sec. 2. R. S., c. 22, § 60, amended. The 7th, 8th, 9th and 10th sentences of section 60 of chapter 22 of the Revised Statutes, as enacted by section 1 of chapter 181 of the public laws of 1955, are hereby amended to read as follows:

The Secretary of State may, in his discretion, after applicant has successfully passed all parts of an examination other than the driving test, issue to the applicant an instruction permit which shall entitle the applicant, while having such permit in his immediate possession, to drive a motor vehicle upon the public highways for a period of 60 90 days when accompanied by a licensed operator who has at least one year of driving experience and is at least 18 years of age and who is occupying a seat beside the driver, except in the event the permittee is operating a motorcycle, motor scooter or motor bike. The fee for all permits shall be \$\frac{\pi}{\pi}\$\$ \$2, which shall include cost of first examination. The fee for all subsequent examinations shall be \$\frac{\pi}{\pi}\$\$ \$2. A renewal permit may be issued for an additional 60 90 days for a fee of \$1\frac{\pi}{\pi}\$ provided, however, that the. The Secretary of State may, in his discretion, issue a restricted instruction permit effective for a school year or for a restricted period to an applicant who is enrolled in a driver education program which includes practice driving.'

### Chapter 215

AN ACT Creating Bartlett's Island, Hancock County, as a Game Management Area.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. R. S., c. 37, § 149, amended. That part of section 149 of chapter 37 of the Revised Statutes, as revised, which relates to Bartlett's Island game preserve, is hereby repealed.

Sec. 2. R. S., c. 37, § 150-A, additional. Chapter 37 of the Revised Statutes, as revised, is hereby amended by adding thereto a new section to be numbered 150-A, to read as follows:
