Chapter 240

AN ACT Relating to Definition of Fiduciary Under Law Appointing Nominees by Banking Institutions.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 59, § 246, amended. Section 246 of chapter 59 of the Revised Statutes, as enacted by chapter 90 of the public laws of 1955, is hereby amended by adding at the end thereof a new sentence to read as follows:

"The term "fiduciary" as used in this section shall include, but shall not be limited to, executors, administrators, guardians, conservators, trustees, agents, custodians and each of them.'

Chapter 241

AN ACT Relating to Unclaimed Bodies.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 66, § 12, amended. Section 12 of chapter 66 of the Revised Statutes is hereby amended by adding thereto a new paragraph to read as follows:

'Notwithstanding the availability of lump sum death benefits under the Federal Social Security Act, the term "buried at public expense" as written in this section shall be deemed to include the unclaimed dead bodies of all indigent persons otherwise within the intendment of this section.'

Chapter 242

AN ACT Relating to Crab Fishing.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 38, § 112, amended. Section 112 of chapter 38 of the Revised Statutes, as revised, is hereby amended by adding a new paragraph following the 1st paragraph to read as follows:

'No license shall be required of any person, whether resident or nonresident, to catch or take crabs along the shore that may be found under rocks or pools left by the receding tides, or by fishing for same by hook and line. Traps shall not be used for such taking. Crabs so taken shall be for the purpose of home consumption only and not for resale or any commercial use.'
