Sec. 7. **Limitation.** Notwithstanding the provisions of section 113-B, the State Highway Commission shall not be required to erect speed signs on any town ways or unimproved state aid highways.

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## Chapter 318

AN ACT Relating to Publication of Specimen Ballots, State Financial Reports, Constitutional Amendments and Referendums in Foreign Language Newspapers.

*Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:*

Sec. 1. R. S., c. 5, § 2, amended. Section 2 of chapter 5 of the Revised Statutes, as amended by chapter 397 of the public laws of 1955, is hereby further amended by adding after the 3rd sentence, a new sentence, as follows:

'Such specimen ballot may be published in the English language in a foreign language newspaper.'

Sec. 2. R. S., c. 10, § 19, amended. Section 19 of chapter 10 of the Revised Statutes is hereby amended by adding at the end thereof a new sentence, as follows:

'Such explanatory statement may be published in the English language in a foreign language newspaper.'

Sec. 3. R. S., c. 16, § 33, amended. The 2nd paragraph of section 33 of chapter 16 of the Revised Statutes, as amended by chapter 398 of the public laws of 1955, is hereby further amended by adding after the 2nd sentence thereof, a new sentence, as follows:

'Such condensed summary may be published in the English language in a foreign language newspaper.'
