## Chapter 329

### AN ACT Permitting Governor and Council to Purchase Real Estate Adjacent to State House.

*Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:*

Sec. 1. R. S., c. 1, § 24-A, additional. Chapter 1 of the Revised Statutes is hereby amended by adding thereto a new section to be numbered 24-A, to read as follows:

#### 'Purchase by State.

Sec. 24-A. Purchase of real estate by State. Whenever it determines that the public exigencies requires it, the Governor and Council may purchase or may take by eminent domain real estate adjacent to the State House in Augusta.'

Sec. 2. R. S., c. 16, § 25, amended. Section 25 of chapter 16 of the Revised Statutes is hereby amended by adding at the end thereof a new paragraph, as follows:

'The Governor and Council may allocate from the "Unappropriated Surplus" amounts not to exceed \$500,000 for the purchase of real estate adjacent to the State House in accordance with section 24-A of chapter 1.'

## Chapter 330

### AN ACT Increasing Registration Fees for Motor Vehicles and Operators' Licenses.

*Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:*

Sec. 1. R. S., c. 22, § 16, sub-§ I, ¶ A, amended. Paragraph A of subsection I of section 16 of chapter 22 of the Revised Statutes is hereby amended to read as follows:

'A. Used for the conveyance of passengers,

0 horsepower to and including 17 horsepower	\$10	\$11
18 horsepower to and including 24 horsepower	12	13
25 horsepower to and including 30 horsepower	14	15
31 horsepower and over	16	17'

Sec. 3. R. S., c. 22, § 16, sub-§ I, ¶ D, amended. The next to the last sentence of paragraph D of subsection I of section 16 of chapter 22 of the Revised Statutes is hereby amended to read as follows:

'A fee of ~~\$2~~ \$3 for each vehicle to be moved shall accompany the application.'

Sec. 4. R. S., c. 22, § 19, amended. The 1st paragraph of section 19 of chapter 22 of the Revised Statutes is hereby amended to read as follows:

'With each application for registration of a motor truck shall be paid an annual registration fee graduated as follows when equipped with pneumatic tires:

Sec. 6. R. S., c. 22, § 60, amended. The 2nd sentence of section 60 of chapter 22 of the Revised Statutes is hereby amended to read as follows:

'Applications to operate motor vehicles shall be presented by mail or otherwise to the Secretary of State upon blanks prepared under his authority, and

which shall ~~therein~~ call for specific answers to questions of a character designed to show the experience and competency of the applicant to operate a motor vehicle; ~~a.~~ A fee of ~~\$2~~ \$3 shall accompany the application.'

Sec. 7. Effective date. The provisions of this act for registration fees and operators' license fees shall be effective for the calendar year 1958.

## Chapter 331

### AN ACT Creating the Maine Commercial Feed Law.

*Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:*

Sec 1. R. S., c. 32, §§ 236-A - 236-K, additional. Chapter 32 of the Revised Statutes is hereby amended by adding thereto 11 new sections to be numbered 236-A to 236-K, inclusive, to read as follows:

#### 'Maine Commercial Feed Law.

Sec. 236-A. Title. Sections 236-A to 236-K, inclusive, shall be known as the "Maine Commercial Feed Law."

Sec. 236-B. Enforcing official. Sections 236-A to 236-K, inclusive, shall be administered by the Commissioner of Agriculture, hereinafter referred to as the "Commissioner."

Sec. 236-C. Definitions. As used in sections 236-A to 236-K, inclusive, the following words and phrases shall have the following meanings:

"Brand" means the term, design or trademark and other specific designation under which an individual commercial feed is distributed in this State.

"Commercial feed" means all materials which are distributed for use as feed for animals other than man except:

- I. Unmixed whole seed and meals made directly from the entire seeds;
- II. Unground hay;
- III. Whole or ground straw, stover, silage, cobs and hulls when not mixed with other materials.

"Distribute" means to offer for sale, sell, barter or otherwise supply commercial feeds.

"Distributor" means one who registers a commercial feed or feeds under the provisions of sections 236-A to 236-K, inclusive, or who offers for sale, sells, barter or otherwise supplies commercial feeds.

"Label" means a display of written, printed or graphic matter upon the container in which a commercial feed is distributed.

"Official sample" means any sample of commercial feed taken by the Commissioner.
