Chapter 347

AN ACT Relating to Duties of and Reimbursement for the Reporter of Decisions.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. R. S., c. 104, § 2, amended. Section 2 of chapter 104 of the Revised Statutes as amended by section one of chapter 175 of the public laws of 1955 is hereby further amended by adding a new sentence to follow the 3rd sentence to read as follows:

'Upon receipt of an opinion from the law court the Reporter shall prepare a concise abstract thereof in the form of a letter to be immediately distributed to members of the court and such others as the Chief Justice may direct.'

- Sec. 2. R. S., c. 104, § 5, amended. Section 5 of chapter 104 of the Revised Statutes is hereby amended to read as follows:
- 'Sec. 5. Reimbursement for expenses. The Reporter shall be reimbursed by the State for charges actually and reasonably incurred by him for clerk hire, stationery, postage, expressage and incidental expenses, to the extent that such charges exceed the amounts he is entitled to retain out of profits to pay the same pursuant to the provisions of section 3, but such reimbursement by the State shall not exceed \$\frac{\partial \pi}{\partial \pi} \frac{\partial \pi}{\partial \pi} \fra

Chapter 348

AN ACT Relating to Definition of Public School Under State Retirement System.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

- R. S., c. 63-A, § 1, amended. The 8th paragraph from the end of section 1 of chapter 63-A of the Revised Statutes, as enacted by section 1 of chapter 417 of the public laws of 1955, is hereby amended to read as follows:
- "Public school" shall mean any public school conducted within the State under the authority and supervision of a duly elected board of education or superintending school committee and any day school which received any direct state aid in 1950, and municipal tuition funds amounting to at least twice the amount of such state aid, during the same year."
