CHAP, 416

PUBLIC LAWS, 1957

I of chapter 478 of the public laws of 1955, is hereby further amended to read as follows:

Each member of the Senate and House of Representatives shall receive \$7,250 \$1,400 for the regular session of the Legislature, and shall be paid for travel at each legislative session once each week at the rate of 5c per mile to and from his place of abode,; the mileage to be determined by the most reasonable direct route.'

'The President of the Senate and Speaker of the House of Representatives shall each receive \$1,500 \$1,650 for each regular session of the Legislature, with the same mileage as other members, and subject to the same deduction in case of each absence.'

Sec. 2. Effective date. This act shall take effect on the first Wednesday of January, 1959.

### Chapter 415

AN ACT Relating to Automobile Travel by State Employees.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 16, § 31, amended. The 1st sentence of section 31 of chapter 16 of the Revised Statutes is hereby amended to read as follows:

'The State shall pay for the use of privately owned automobiles for travel by employees of the State in the business of the State not more than 7e 8c per mile for the first 5,000 miles actually travelled by such employees on such business in any one fiscal year, and 6c for each mile exceeding 5,000 miles; provided, however, that the The State shall pay inspectors of seed potatoes 8c for every mile so travelled.'

### Chapter 416

AN ACT Relating to Salaries and Clerk Hire of Certain County Officers.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

#### Androscoggin County.

Sec. 1. R. S., c. 89, § 6, amended. That part of section 6 of chapter 89 of the Revised Statutes which relates to the salaries of the county commissioners of Androscoggin county is hereby amended to read as follows:

'Androscoggin, \$\frac{\pmathbf{x}}{1,320}\$ \$1,520, except the chairman of said commission who, in addition to his regular duties, shall superintend the county buildings, and for all his services his annual salary shall be the sum of \$\frac{\pmathbf{x}}{1,980}\$ \$2,180.'
