## Chapter 83

#### AN ACT Relating to Cheverus Columbus Club.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Directors and officers of Cheverus Columbus Club. Frank E. Lyman, Sr. and Stirling C. Mills, both of Cape Elizabeth in the County of Cumberland and State of Maine; John J. Buckley, Robert E. Austin, William M. Hogan and Edward R. Twomey, all of South Portland in said county; and William J. O'Mara of Portland in said county are hereby constituted the directors and trustees until the next annual meeting or their successors are elected and qualified, of Cheverus Columbus Club, a corporation organized and existing under the laws of the State of Maine, which are now Chapter 54 of the Revised Statutes of 1954, to supply the offices of directors and trustees of the said corporation and to wage and conduct the affairs and business of the said corporation in accordance with the charter of said corporation and the provisions of law. The organization of such corporation is hereby ratified, confirmed and declared to be legal and valid.

### Chapter 84

### AN ACT Changing Name of "Town of Madawaska Municipal Court" to "Madawaska Municipal Court."

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

P. & S. L., 1955, c. 74, §§ 1 and 2, amended. Wherever in sections 1 and 2 of chapter 74 of the private and special laws of 1955 the words "Town of Madawaska Municipal Court" appear, they are hereby amended to read "Madawaska Municipal Court."

### Chapter 85

#### AN ACT to Incorporate Finance Planning, Inc.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. Corporators; corporate name; powers and privileges. Ralph H. McCluskey, of Lewiston in the County of Androscoggin and State of Maine; Clifton E. Bourdelais, of North Easton in the County of Bristol and Robert A.

#### PRIVATE AND SPECIAL, 1957

Allison, of Needham in the County of Norfolk, both of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts, or such of them as may vote to accept this charter, with their associates, successors and assigns, are hereby made a body corporate to be known as "Finance Planning, Inc.," and as such shall have the power to enact suitable by-laws and regulations, and elect such officers as it deems desirable to effect its corporate purposes and to be possessed of all the powers, privileges and immunities and subject to all duties and obligations conferred on corporations by the general corporation law of this State.

Sec. 2. Principal office. The principal office and place of business in Maine is to be located in the City of Lewiston, County of Androscoggin, or as fixed by the directors, and the corporation may establish branch offices.

Sec. 3. Purposes. The purpose for which this corporation is formed and the nature of the business to be conducted by it are as follows: to borrow money and secure the payment thereof by pledging its assets or any part thereof; to engage in the business of making loans of \$2,500 or less under the provisions of sections 210 to 227, inclusive, of Chapter 59 of the Revised Statutes of 1954, and acts amendatory thereof or additional thereto; provided, however, that it shall obtain a license from the Bank Commissioner, as provided in said sections.

Sec. 4. Capital stock. The corporation may determine the capital stock of the said corporation and the division of same into shares either of par or nonpar, common or preferred, and the amount of dividend to be paid or declared thereon; with the right to change the capital stock by majority vote of the holders of stock issued and outstanding, and having voting power, the fees therefor to be paid as prescribed by the laws of Maine.

Sec. 5. Subject to supervision of Bank Commissioner. The corporation shall be subject to the supervision of the Bank Commissioner and he shall have the same authority over it as he has over savings banks, trust companies and loan and building associations.

Sec. 6. First meeting; how called. Any 2 of the incorporators named in this act may call the first meeting of the corporation by mailing a written notice signed by said 2 incorporators, postage paid, to the other incorporator, 5 days at least before the day of the meeting, naming the time, place and purpose of such meeting; and at such meeting the necessary officers may be chosen, by-laws adopted and any other corporate business transacted, provided that without such notice all such incorporators may meet voluntarily at any time and effect their organization by electing officers, adopting by-laws and transacting other lawful business.

Sec. 7. Fee payable to Secretary of State. The certificate mentioned in section 5 of Chapter 53 of the Revised Statutes of 1954 shall not be received and filed by the Secretary of State except upon payment to him, for the use of the State, of the sum of \$500, in addition to the fees prescribed by section 12 of said chapter 53.
