CHAP. 113

The result of the vote shall be declared by the municipal officers of the town of Fort Fairfield and due certificate thereof filed by the town clerk with the Secretary of State.

#### Chapter 112

AN ACT Repealing the Incorporation of the Master, Wardens and Members of Freeport Lodge.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

P. & S. L., 1824, c. 267, repealed. Chapter 267 of the private and special laws of 1824 is hereby repealed.

#### Chapter 113

AN ACT Amending the Charter of the Town of Lincoln.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. P. & S. L., 1939, c. 62, § 2, amended. Section 2 of chapter 62 of the private and special laws of 1939 is hereby amended to read as follows:

'Sec. 2. Election of officers. At such annual town meetings the voters shall elect by ballot as hereinafter provided, 5 inhabitants of said town to be known as councillors, and a member of 5 members of the superintending school committee, in accordance with the Revised Statutes of 1930 1954 and amendments thereto, a town clerk and a town treasurer and an auditor of accounts.

At the \*\*st\* annual town meeting held under this act in March, 1958, said councillors shall be elected as follows: a for a term of \*\* year\*, a for a term of a years, \*\* for a term of a year\* previously, and thereafter at each of said annual town meetings a councillors shall be chosen as herein provided, each for a term of a years, provided, however, that in each ard year but it councillor shall be chosen; and provided further, that vacancies in the office of town councillor due to death, resignation or other cause shall be filled at the next annual meeting, or a special meeting if necessary, for the unexpired term.

At said annual town meeting in 1958, one member of the superintending school committee shall be elected for a term of 3 years, one for a term of 2 years and one for a term of one year; and thereafter the annual vacancies caused by expiration of terms shall be filled for terms of 3 years. It is intended that this act shall in no way affect the present tenure of office of the present members of the superintending school committee.
