Chapter 117

AN ACT Relating to Vacations for Members of the Lewiston Police Department.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. P. S. & L., 1939, c. 8, Art. XI, § 16, repealed and replaced. Section 16 of Article XI of chapter 8 of the private and special laws of 1939, as amended by section 8 of chapter 95 of the private and special laws of 1947, and repealed and replaced by section 5 of chapter 113 of the private and special laws of 1947, is hereby repealed and the following enacted in place thereof:

'Sec. 16. Vacations. After one year of service, and less than 5 years of service, all personnel of the department shall be entitled to 2 weeks' vacation with pay each calendar year at such time as may be prescribed by the commission.

Each member of the department having served over 5 years as a permanent member shall be entitled to 3 weeks' vacation with pay each calendar year at such time as the commission may prescribe.'

Sec. 2. P. & S. L., 1939, c. 8, Art. XI, § 11, amended. The 2nd sentence of section 11 of Article XI of chapter 8 of the private and special laws of 1939, as amended, is hereby further amended to read as follows:

'She (police matron) shall be entitled to a vacation of \Rightarrow weeks in each calendar year at such time as may be appointed by the chief of police, with pay as provided in section 16 at such time as the commission may prescribe.'

Sec. 3. P. & S. L., 1939, c. 8, Art. XI, § 14, amended. The 2nd sentence of section 14 of Article XI of chapter 8 of the private and special laws of 1939, as amended, is hereby further amended to read as follows:

'He (the chief of police) shall be entitled to 2 weeks' a vacation each calendar year with pay to be taken when and as he may desire as provided in section 16 at such time as the commission may prescribe.'

Effective August 28, 1957
