#### Chapter 181

AN ACT to Reactivate the State Committee on Educational Television.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

- Sec. 1. A State Committee on Educational Television reactivated. The Governor, with the advice and consent of the Council, shall appoint a committee of 7 members, consisting of 2 from the House of Representatives and one from the Senate, the Commissioner of Education, the President of the University of Maine and 2 members who represent the public generally, and shall designate the chairman.
- Sec. 2. Duties of the Committee. The State Committee on Educational Television shall continue the study of educational television begun by the Committee on Educational Television created by Chapter 204 of the Private and Special Laws of 1955. A report of the Committee's activities and findings shall be made to the Governor and Legislature not later than January 1, 1959.
- Sec. 3. Time of meeting; expenses. Said Committee shall meet at the place designated by and at the call of the Chairman, not less than 3 times a year, for the promotion of its activities. The members shall be paid necessary expenses incurred in the performance of their duties.
- Sec. 4. Appropriation. There is hereby appropriated from the general fund the sum of \$1,000 for the biennium ending June 30, 1959 to the said Committee, to be expended in the promotion of its objectives and in the payment of necessary office work and the necessary expenses of the Committee.

### Chapter 182

AN ACT to Appropriate Monies for the Expenditures of State Government and for Other Purposes for the Fiscal Years Ending June 30, 1958 and June 30, 1959.

Emergency preamble. Whereas, acts and resolves passed by the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

Whereas, the said 90-day period will not terminate until after the beginning of the next fiscal year; and

Whereas, certain obligations and expenses incident to the operation of departments and institutions will become due and payable on or immediately after July 1, 1957; and

#### PRIVATE AND SPECIAL, 1957

CHAP. 182

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore,

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. Appropriations for necessary expenditures of government. In order to provide for the necessary expenditures of government and for other purposes for the next two fiscal years—from July 1, 1957, to June 30, 1958 and from July 1, 1958, to June 30, 1959—the following sums or as much thereof as shall severally be found necessary, as designated in the following tabulations, are hereby appropriated out of any monies in the general fund not otherwise appropriated. Upon receipt of allotments duly approved by the Governor and Council based upon work programs submitted to the Commissioner of Finance and Administration, the State Controller shall authorize expenditures of these appropriations and revenues accruing thereto, together with expenditures for other purposes necessary to the conduct of state government on the basis of such allotments and not otherwise.

It is the intent of the Legislature that allotments for personal services, capital expenditures and amounts for all other departmental expenses shall not exceed the amounts shown in the budget document or as they may be revised by the Committee on Appropriations and Financial Affairs unless approved by the Commissioner of Finance and Administration and the Governor and Council.

It is further the intent of the Legislature in creating the Fuel Reserve Fund to provide relief for those general fund accounts affected by increased fuel costs, in the event that actual costs exceed the estimates as projected in the various budgets for the next biennium and which cannot be absorbed in their regular legislative appropriations. The transfer of funds from this account shall be approved by the State Budget Officer with the advice and consent of the Governor and Council.

And it is further provided that the Controller is authorized to close his books as soon as practicable after the close of the fiscal years ending June 30, 1958, and June 30, 1959. Any bills presented after those dates may be paid from appropriations for the ensuing year on recommendation of the Controller if within the amounts of approved allotments.

Whenever it appears to the Commissioner of Finance and Administration that the anticipated income of the State will not be sufficient to meet the expenditures authorized by the Legislature, he shall so report to the Governor and Council and they may curtail allotments so that expenditures will not exceed the anticipated income.

At the end of each fiscal year of the biennium, all unencumbered appropriation balances representing state monies, except those that carry forward as provided by law, shall be lapsed to unappropriated surplus as provided by Section 25 of Chapter 16 of the Revised Statutes of 1954. At the end of each fiscal year of the biennium, all encumbered appropriation balances shall be carried forward to the next fiscal year, but in no event shall encumbered appropriation balances be carried more than once.

There shall be paid from the general highway fund the cost of accounting, auditing, purchasing and legal services furnished from the general fund appropriations. This revenue shall be credited to the general fund.

### Chapter 183

#### AN ACT to Reactivate a State Committee on Aging.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

- Sec. 1. A State Committee on Aging reactivated. The Governor, with the advice and consent of the Council, shall appoint a committee of 11 members, consisting of one each from the House of Representatives, the Senate, the Department of Health and Welfare, Department of Education, Maine Employment Security Commission, Department of Development of Industry and Commerce, Institutional Service and 4 representative citizens, and shall designate a chairman.
- Sec. 2. Duties of the Committee. The State Committee on Aging shall continue the study of the problems of Maine's aging population. The Committee shall assist in the organization of local committees on aging. It shall provide leadership and stimulation, at the state level, for the many organizations that are interested in the problems of the elderly citizens of Maine. It shall distribute materials, provide information and furnish speakers as requested. It shall report to the Governor and the members of the 99th Legislature not later than January 1, 1959.
- Sec. 3. Authority to appoint subcommittees. The State Committee on Aging is hereby authorized to organize subcommittees to assist in carrying out the provisions of section 2.
- Sec. 4. Time of meetings, expenses. Said Committee shall meet at the call of the Chairman, and not less than 6 times during the biennium. The members shall be paid necessary expenses incurred in the performance of their duties.
- Sec. 5. Appropriation. There is hereby appropriated from the general fund of the State the sum of \$2,500 for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1958 to the said Committee, to be expended in the promotion of its objectives and in payment of necessary office work and supplies and necessary expenses of the Committee. Such appropriation shall not lapse, but shall remain a continuing carrying account until June 30, 1959.
