CHAP. 4

RESOLVES, 1957

Resolved: That any unexpended balances of the money appropriated by this resolve shall lapse on June 30, 1959.

Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this resolve shall take effect when approved.

Chapter 2

RESOLVE, in Favor of Georgianna Berthiaume of Oakland.

Georgianna Berthiaume; reimbursed. **Resolved:** That the sum of \$110 be, and hereby is, appropriated from the funds of the State Liquor Commission to be paid to Georgianna Berthiaume of Oakland, to reimburse her for a retail malt liquor license issued for the year 1956, and which she was unable to use because the property was destroyed by fire a week later.

Chapter 3

RESOLVE, Relating to Sale of Digest of Opinions of the Law Court.

Digest of opinions of Law Court; sale and distribution. **Resolved:** That the Attorney General be, and hereby is, authorized to deliver to the State Librarian all copies of the digest of the opinions of the Law Court which was provided for by Chapter 105 of the resolves of 1945 and chapter 186 of the resolves of 1949; and be it further

Resolved: That the State Librarian be, and hereby is, authorized to fix the price at which such copies may be sold and delivered, and shall thereafter make sales at the price so fixed; beginning with Volume 147 of the Maine Reports, the price of said digest shall be reduced \$1 whenever a volume of the Maine Reports is printed, provided that no volume of the digest shall be sold at a price less than \$10. All proceeds from such sales shall be deposited to the credit of the general fund of the State; and be it further

Resolved: That chapter 105 of the resolves of 1945, chapter 186 of the resolves of 1949 and chapter 146 of the resolves of 1951 be, and hereby are, repealed.

Chapter 4

RESOLVE, Relating to Sale and Distribution of Index to Private and Special Laws.

Index to private and special laws; sale and distribution of. **Resolved:** That the Attorney General be, and hereby is, authorized to deliver to the State Li-

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brarian all excess copies of the index digest to the private and special laws from 1820 to 1944, inclusive; and be it further

Resolved: That the State Librarian be, and hereby is, authorized to fix the price at which such excess copies may be sold and delivered, and shall thereafter make sales at the price so fixed. All proceeds from such sales shall be deposited to the credit of the general fund of the State; and be it further

Resolved: That chapter 4 of the Resolves of 1945 be, and hereby is, repealed.

Chapter 5

RESOLVE, Regulating Fishing in Haley Pond, Franklin County.

Haley pond; regulating fishing. Resolved: That the Commissioner of Inland Fisheries and Game be, and hereby is, authorized and directed to issue a rule and regulation opening Haley pond, located in the towns of Rangeley and Dallas, Franklin county, to ice fishing for all fish except bass during February and March.

Chapter 6

RESOLVE, Prohibiting Live Fish as Bait in Spring Lake, Somerset County.

Spring lake; prohibiting live fish as bait. Resolved: That the Commissioner of Inland Fisheries and Game be, and hereby is, authorized and directed to issue a rule and regulation prohibiting the use or possession of live fish as bait at Spring lake, T3, R4, Somerset county.

Chapter 7

RESOLVE, Regulating Fishing in Tim Pond, Franklin County.

Tim pond; regulating fishing. Resolved: That the Commissioner of Inland Fisheries and Game be, and hereby is, authorized and directed to issue a rule and regulation opening Tim pond, T2, R4, Franklin county, under the general open-water fishing regulations for Franklin county law except the use or possession of live fish as bait is prohibited.
