CHAP. 21

RESOLVES, 1957

Cumberland and Oxford, to ice fishing under the general laws from ice in until March 31, except that part of the pond from route 302 south to Walkers Bridge which shall be open to fishing under the general laws from February 1st to March 31st.

Chapter 19

RESOLVE, Regulating Fishing for White Perch in Cobbosseecontee Lake, Kennebec County.

Cobbosseecontee lake; regulating fishing for white perch. Resolved: That the Commissioner of Inland Fisheries and Game be, and hereby is, authorized and directed to issue a rule and regulation removing the bag limit on white perch in Cobbosseecontee lake and tributaries in Litchfield, Monmouth, Winthrop, West Gardiner, and Manchester in Kennebec county.

Chapter 20

RESOLVE, Regulating Fishing in Silver Lake, Kennebec County.

Silver lake; regulating fishing. Resolved: That the Commissioner of Inland Fisheries and Game be, and hereby is, authorized and directed to issue a rule and regulation establishing a daily bag limit of 5 fish and prohibiting the use or possession of live fish as bait on Silver lake (Figure Eight pond) in Manchester and Sidney, county of Kennebec.

Chapter 21

RESOLVE, Prohibiting the Use of Live Fish as Bait in Certain Waters in Somerset County.

Somerset county; prohibiting use of live fish as bait. Resolved: That the Commissioner of Inland Fisheries and Game be, and hereby is, authorized and directed to issue a rule and regulation prohibiting the use or possession of live fish as bait on the following waters in Somerset county:

Black Brook pond, Moxie Gore

Knights pond, Moxie Gore and Squaretown

Chapter 22

RESOLVE, Regulating Fishing in Little Ellis Pond, Oxford County.

Little Ellis pond; regulating fishing. Resolved: That the Commissioner of Inland Fisheries and Game be, and hereby is, authorized and directed to issue a rule and regulation opening Little Ellis pond, Oxford county, to fishing with a daily limit of 5 fish. The use or possession of live fish as bait is prohibited.

Chapter 23

RESOLVE, Regulating Ice Fishing in Certain Waters in Aroostook County.

Aroostook county; regulating ice fishing in certain waters. Resolved: That the Commissioner of Inland Fisheries and Game be, and hereby is, authorized and directed to issue a rule and regulation opening the following waters in Aroostook county to ice fishing for all fish except bass, salmon, trout and togue from the time the ice forms in the fall until March 31st:

Glancy lake, New Limerick

Macwahoc lake, Upper, Sherman, T3, R4W

Plunkett pond, Benedicta, Silver Ridge

Flinn pond, T1, R5, W.E.L.S., Benedicta

Rush pond, T2, R6W

Molunkus lake, T2, R5; T1, R5; Macwahoc

Mattaseunk lake, Molunkus

Mud pond, T4, R3, Oakfield

Mud pond, Linneus

Longfellow lake, Orient
