Chapter 28

RESOLVE, Regulating Fishing in Blanchard Ponds, Franklin County.

Blanchard ponds; regulating fishing. Resolved: That the Commissioner of Inland Fisheries and Game be, and hereby is, authorized and directed to issue a rule and regulation opening Blanchard ponds in Davis and Lang Twps., Franklin county, to fly fishing only with a daily limit of 5 fish.

Effective August 28, 1957

Chapter 29

RESOLVE, Regulating Fishing in Tributaries to Baker Pond, Somerset County.

Tributaries to Baker pond; regulating fishing. Resolved: That the Commissioner of Inland Fisheries and Game be, and hereby is, authorized and directed to issue a rule and regulation opening all tributaries to Baker pond in T4, R6, and T5, R6, Somerset county, to fly fishing only with a daily limit of 5 trout.

Effective August 28, 1957

Chapter 30

RESOLVE, Regulating Fishing in Big Island Pond, Franklin County.

Big Island pond; regulating fishing. Resolved: That the Commissioner of Inland Fisheries and Game be, and hereby is, authorized and directed to issue a rule and regulation opening Big Island pond in T3, R5, T2, R6, Franklin county, to fly fishing only with a daily bag limit of 5 fish.

RESOLVE, Regulating Fishing in South Bog Stream, Franklin County.

South Bog stream; regulating fishing. Resolved: That the Commissioner of Inland Fisheries and Game be, and hereby is, authorized and directed to issue
