RESOLVES, 1957

a rule and regulation opening South Bog stream in Rangeley Plt., Franklin county, to fly fishing only with a daily bag limit of 5 fish.

Chapter 32

RESOLVE, Regulating Fishing in Chain of Ponds, Franklin County.

Franklin county; regulating fishing in Chain of Ponds. Resolved: That the Commissioner of Inland Fisheries and Game be, and hereby is, authorized and directed to issue a rule and regulation on Chain of Ponds in T.2, R.6, Franklin county, establishing a daily bag limit of 5 fish and prohibiting the use or possession of live fish as bait.

Chapter 33

RESOLVE, Regulating Fishing in Little Kennebago Lake, Franklin County.

Little Kennebago lake; regulating fishing. Resolved: That the Commissioner of Inland Fisheries and Game be, and hereby is, authorized and directed to issue a rule and regulation opening Little Kennebago lake in T3, R4, Franklin county, to fly fishing only with a daily limit of 5 fish.

Chapter 34

RESOLVE, Regulating Fishing in Houston Brook, Franklin and Somerset Counties.

Houston brook; regulating fishing. Resolved: That the Commissioner of Inland Fisheries and Game be, and hereby is, authorized and directed to issue a rule and regulation establishing the following: On Houston Brook, Dead River Township, Somerset County, Jerusalem Township, Franklin County, daily limit of 5 trout, and use or possession of live fish as bait prohibited.

RESOLVE, Regulating Fishing in Saddleback Mountain Ponds in Franklin County.

Saddleback Mountain Ponds; regulating fishing. Resolved: That the Commissioner of Inland Fisheries and Game be, and hereby is, authorized and di-

rected to issue the following rules and regulations on Saddleback pond, Little Saddleback pond, Ethel pond, Eddy pond, Ledge pond, Midway pond and Rock pond, all in Sandy River plantation, Franklin County.

Daily limit 5 trout. Use or possession of live fish as bait prohibited.

Chapter 36

RESOLVE, Regulating Fishing for White Perch in China Lake and Tributaries, Kennebec County.

China Lake; regulating fishing for white perch. Resolved: The Commissioner of Inland Fisheries and Game be, and hereby is, authorized to issue a rule and regulation providing that there shall be no bag limit on white perch taken in China Lake and tributaries, Kennebec County.

Chapter 37

RESOLVE, Regulating Fishing in Bell Pond, Piscataquis County.

Bell pond; regulating fishing. Resolved: That the Commissioner of Inland Fisheries and Game be, and hereby is, authorized and directed to issue a rule and regulation closing Bell pond, town of Monson, Piscataquis county, to all fishing except fly fishing and trolling artificial flies and establishing a day limit of 5 fish.

RESOLVE, Authorizing the Forest Commissioner to Convey Certain Land in Woodland, Aroostook County.

Forest Commissioner; authorization to convey land in Woodland. Resolved: That the Forest Commissioner be, and hereby is, authorized and directed to convey to Minnie C. Monson of Woodland and Charlotte Ek of Portland, the interest of the State in lot six (6) in Woodland, Aroostook county upon reimbursement to the State for expenses the State has incurred.
